
MISSION

The VSV 'Leonardo da Vinci' is the TU Delft Aerospace Engineering students' study association. Its aim is to enrich its members' lives at university by offering them:

- Support in their studies
- A social platform
- Career development

The association achieves this thanks to the drive and ambition of its student members and their professional attitude. The board of the VSV endeavours to be as open and as transparent as possible towards VSV members and always to adopt a critical approach to the way the association operates. The VSV also forges links between students and their future employers. Finally, VSV 'Leonardo da Vinci' is a well-known name in the aerospace industry in the Netherlands.

The activities of the VSV can be divided into the three key areas detailed below.





Context

In its activities, the VSV depends on several key players: students of Aerospace Engineering, the Faculty of Aerospace Engineering/TU Delft, and the general aerospace industry. In the wake of recent study-related measures, including the binding recommendation on continuation of studies, Aerospace Engineering students are expected to shift their focus more towards their studies during the next five years. The VSV is also anticipating a reduction in the financial support it receives from TU Delft, which will affect the compensation its members receive for the delay in their studies caused by their work for the association.

Development

In the next five years, the VSV 'Leonardo da Vinci' aims to achieve significant development in four areas:

- Internal reform
- Network internationalisation
- Study support
- Student and staff commitment

In the years ahead, the VSV will place a strong emphasis on professionalising the association. At the end of that period, the VSV will have a modern, integrated and fully integrated IT solution at its disposal, enabling it to work efficiently and effectively. The VSV will also review its range of activities in order to ensure that they fully reflect its members' wishes.

In addition, the association aims to have cooperative alliances with all leading international aerospace organisations by the end of the five-year period.

The VSV's study support platform will also be expanded in order to meet the specific wishes of its members. On the one hand, this will involve extending study support, such as shared study facilities and providing training courses. On the other hand, its contribution towards quality control in the Master curriculum will be further enhanced to reach the same standard as for Bachelor's courses by the end of the next five years.

This means that, within the next five year, the VSV will have changed to such an extent that both Bachelor's and Master's students will feel that it adds value to their student life. In order to achieve this, the association is committed to a high level of transparency. Furthermore, the VSV will then be a true reflection of the student population in the AE faculty. Finally, faculty staff will also recognise the added value the association provides for students and communicate this to others.
